Orientation
During Welcome Week, you'll participate in special orientation programs that include neighborhood walking tours, community service opportunities, and theatre outings. You'll meet new people to get to know more about the University, and experience the city. You'll also attend orientation programs at your school or college that show you what it means to succeed academically. For example, College of Arts and Science freshmen all read the same text over the summer, and during orientation, they meet in small discussion groups with faculty members and, later on, attend related theatrical performances. Stern School of Business freshmen are also assigned a text to read and later meet for a tea with the deans and an informal discussion. At the Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, and Human Development, you'll take a New Student Seminar, and at the Gallatin School of Individualized Study, you'll participate in the New Student Convocation. At Tisch School of the Arts, you'll be introduced to your upperclass student mentor, with whom you corresponded over the summer. At the Silver School of Social Work, you'll attend a Q&A with faculty members, and at the College of Nursing and the Preston Robert Tisch Center for Hospitality, Tourism, and Sports Management, you'll meet with your deans and talk to current students and alumni. Students in the Global Liberal Studies Program and the Liberal Studies Program participate in small discussion groups and informal seminars with faculty and advisers. Special sessions for the freshman-year programs in Europe are held on site.
